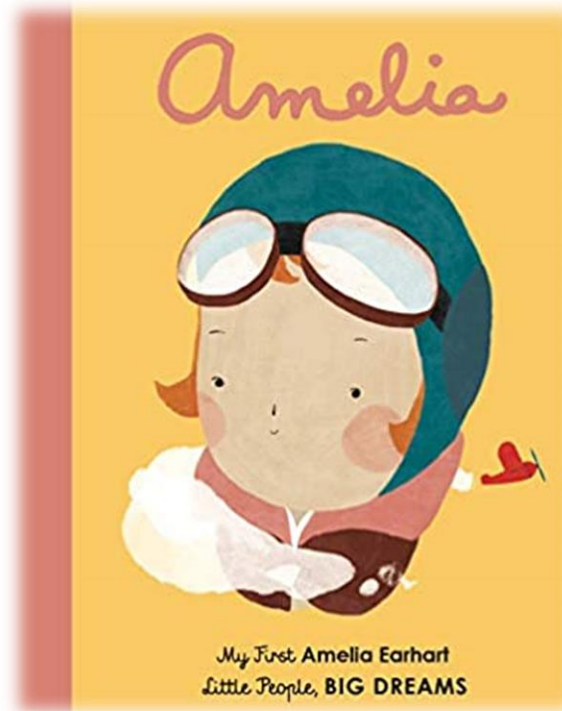


Amelia Earhart by Maria Isabel Sanchez Vegara

Audience: Young Readers 5-7 year olds

Key Outcome: Pupils write a sequential biography of aspects of an Explorer's life

Deserved - something that you earn or are given because of your behaviour

Founded – to set up something

Navigator - an officer on a ship or aircraft responsible for directing its course
