## Key Grammar:

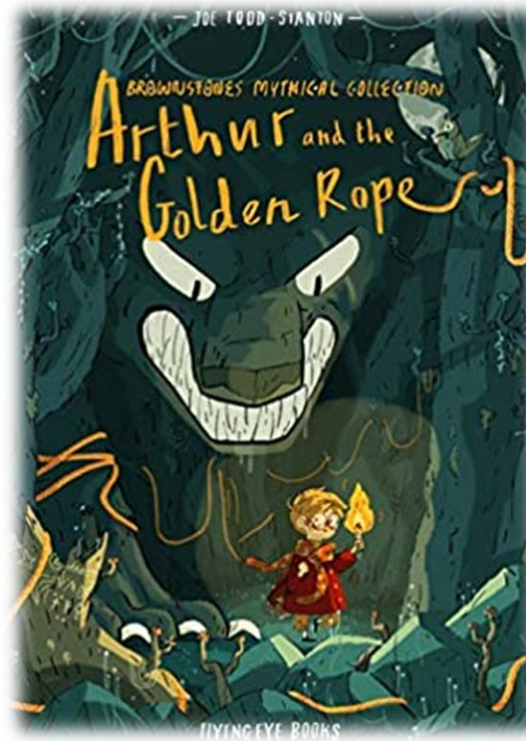
