## Key Grammar:

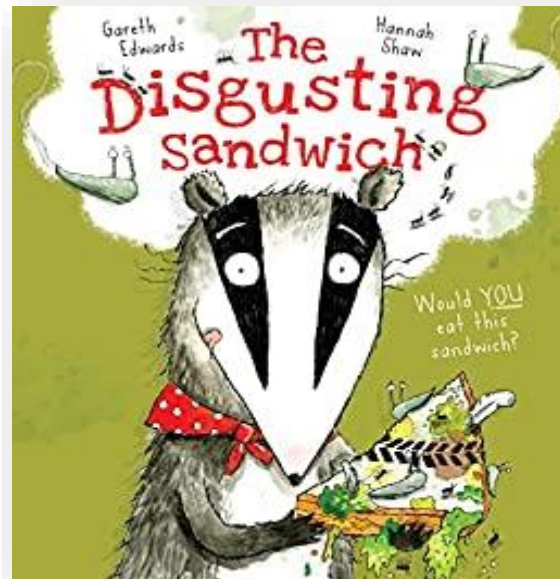
- Use expanded noun phrases.

## About the Book:
