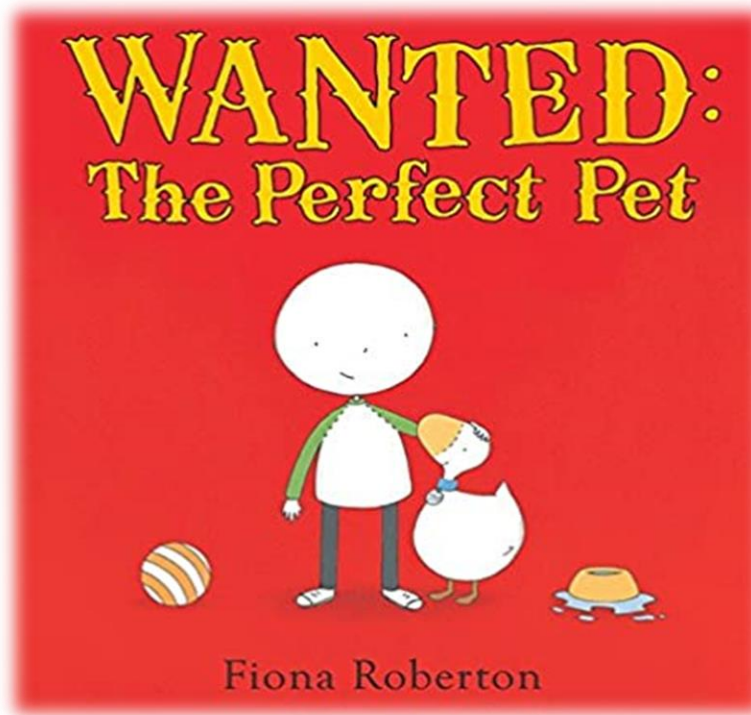


WANTED: The Perfect Pet by Fiona Robertson
