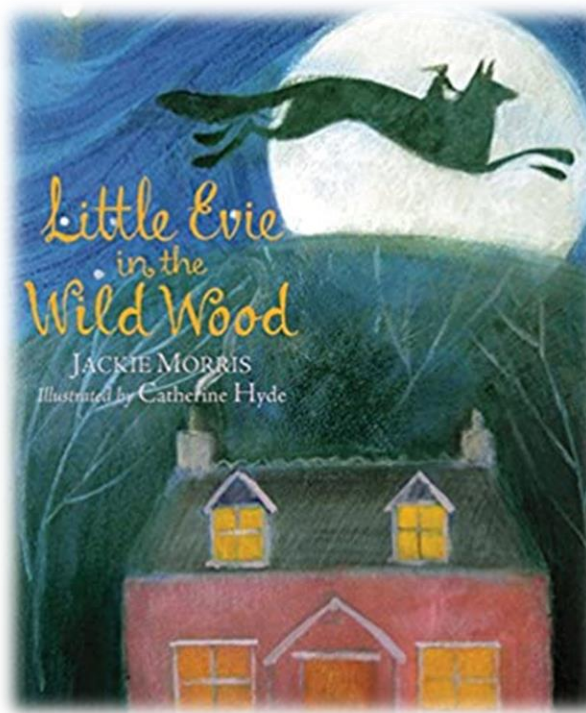


Little Evie in the Wild Wood by Jackie Morris

Key Grammar:

- using conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions to express time, place and cause
- using paragraphs as a way to group related material
- to punctuate speech correctly



About the Book:

Little Evie ventures into the wild woods with her basket of jam tarts and walks further and further into the trees, far from home. In a deep dark cave, she finds – a huge wolf. The wolf comes closer and closer and then Evie and the wolf share the tarts, sitting on the grass. Afterwards the wolf gives Evie a ride home on his back!

Key Vocabulary:

Stile - steps that allows people but not animals to climb over a fence or wall.

Mournful – sadness/regret
