



Learning Sequence:

- Support the children to name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body by drawing around each other.
- Name, draw and label the basic external and internal body parts.
- Go on a senses hunt and identify which part of the body is associated with each sense.
- Compare similarities and differences between humans by identifying how they are similar and different from each other.

Final Outcome: Write a senses poem about 'winter' or 'ice'.



Key Skills:

- I can identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense.

Key Vocabulary

Sight	Your eyes let you see all the things around you.
Hearing	Your ears let you listen to all the things around you. Your brain is able to tell what the different sounds are.
Touch	Your skin gives you the sense of touch. You can tell if something is warm, cold, rough or smooth without even looking at it.
Taste	Your sense of taste comes from your tongue. You can tell if something tastes bitter or sweet and whether you like a taste or not.
Smell	You smell using your nose. Your nose can tell if things smell nice or not nice.

Key Facts and Knowledge:

- There are 5 senses- sight, hearing, touch, taste and smell.
- Senses are linked to parts of the body-eyes, ears, hands, mouth, nose.
- We all have the same body parts but we all look different.
- Some things are similar and some things are different.
