## Final Outcome

- To design and sew a travel pouch using fabric

1. Thread your needle and tie a knot in the end.



2. Push the needle up through the fabric.



3. Push the needle back down through the fabric, near to where you came up.



4. Push the needle back through the fabric, leaving a gap from the previous stitch.



5. Push the needle back down through the fabric again to make your second stitch.
