Write a letter to Council opposing/ supporting the proposed building of a Mushroom Factory in Pinvin

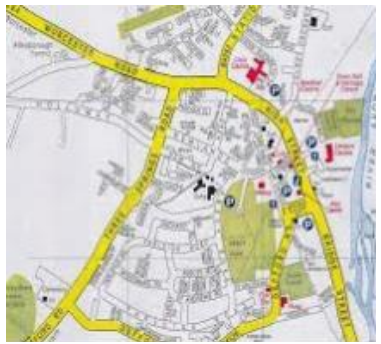
